> Karin,

>

> I have not fallen off the face of the earth, but I have to admit that
> implementing the last additional features and supporting the Streetfax
> website is not a top priority for me right now. This is for a few
> reasons.

>

> The first of which is that I feel as if I have done my share of work to
> fulfill the first phase of development. There are a few changes that I
> have yet to upload, and I will upload those when I get around to it. But
> it seems that the list of things for me to do keeps growing. There is no
> reason why this should be the case. Anything else you want me to do
> belongs either in another phase of development or a separate contract, but
> cannot simply be added onto a list of things for me to do now. I will
> upload the final features to the site after my finals are done, but it
> seems likely that then you will have new things for me to do, or changes
> to be made to those features. This is not the way business should be
> done. You do not have the right to continually have me make changes to
> the site, or even support features I developed before. This was not a
> part of the deal, and therefore it should not be expected.

> The second reason that working on Streetfax is not a high priority for me
> at this point is that it is not supporting me financially. I contracted
> out my services for money, and even though I seem to continually be
> providing services, I don't seem to be receiving any money from you guys.
> The deal was for \$18k. I received \$3k upfront and \$5k over the summer,
> and that's it from the original deal. There was a side deal for the
> scroll search which was for \$1.5k of which I have been paid \$1k. The rest
> was to be paid on a monthly basis, but now, five months after the school
> year has begun, I haven't received anything, yet you still expect me to
> provide support and continue developing. In contrast, other employers
> pay me as they are supposed to, and in return for providing payment
> reliably, I am more comfortable giving them more of my time, since I know
> I'll see money in return. After dealing with you guys, and the number of
> times you've threatened to reduce the amount of money I will receive, I

> can't be certain what I'm going to get after all of this programming. To
> date I have received \$9k out of a total \$19.5k that was owed to me. That
> is less than half of what needs to be paid, and this is after having an
> application which you have been able to use in a live site for months now.

>
> The third reason for Streetfax not being a very high priority is that
> there are many other things I'd like to, and have started to, work
> on. I am at a school surrounded by some of the smartest people in the
> world, cultivating ideas and constantly coming up with great projects to
> work on. The last thing I need right now is someone calling me twice a
> day asking if I've uploaded some small changes to a site that I made eight
> months ago, especially when my motivation for continuing to do any work
> for that project is slanted by concerns of when I will see anything for my
> time.

>
> So that is me leveling with you, and trying to let you understand how I
> feel about the project at this point. I am not adverse to working on it
> -- I am just short on time. My time is valuable, and seems better spent
> on things that I know, or at least can reasonably expect, will produce
> some sort of gratification in the near future. This is evident through my
> other work and other contracts, which all seem to go smoothly.

>
> At this point you guys have a choice. Since this is a purely monetary
> relationship, if you want first rate service, you need to start paying me.
> If you want new features or support on old features, you need to draw up a
> new contract and make an offer competitive with my other contracts. It's
> not my style to exercise the option to remove work I've already done, but
> I do think it's reasonable for me to stop providing services until payment
> is tendered. It seems like you have a working business model going, so
> advancing my payment should not be difficult.

>
> I will let you know when I upload Jeff's changes, and request that you
> likewise let me know when and for how much you cut me a check. I will be
> wrapped up in finals for the next few days, so I will not be answering my
> phone, but feel free to email and I'll respond as soon as possible.
