Paul,

As of this morning, all of the functionality is present and polished in the website. My partner and I took all of your points into account when working on the last set of revisions, and you will find that all but a few minor points have been incorporated into this version of the site. The two things I can think of that are not present yet are the hourglass image on the search results page (it turns out the image has a white background and didn't display well on the green, so I'll have to get a new one from Andy) and the implementation of the latest syntax for sentence generation. I have programmed in all of the latest syntax for the sentence generation, but since all of the pictures currently in the database use an older standard which is not always compatible with the newer one, I decided to keep the older sentence generation engine in there for the tests so you could get a feel for everything.

I looked into what's going on with the emails. It looks like the cheapest option for unlimited emails will be a 30 domain license for \$199 from Plesk. The only other option that I could find on the site was a 10-pack of 10 domain licenses for \$1000, with no added advantage. Once we get those licenses, I'll show you how to add any email address you want. The other thing we're waiting on at this point is Verisign. Once that's in place, I'll add an extra page for billing in the special requests sequence to interface with it. I'll also make a page where adjusters can purchase accounts with credit cards directly from the site. Neither of these two scripts should require any major changes to the database since the billing info won't be stored there (it will be stored by Verisign) so there will just be a bit of scripting to do.

So this should basically be it. I expect that you'll request many small changes, so we'll take care of those as they come up. Feel free to let me know if you want anything to be changed whether it's just something small in the layout or some actual functional detail.

My partner has written up extensive documentation for the backend which you can use for reference and for direction as you test the system. If you have any questions about the system, feel free to get in touch with me as they come up. Note that you should log in as admin/admin.

It has been very nice working with you so far, and I am confident that this product will meet your expectations for this round of development.
