The middle initial L in its slant, in its relationship of the upper loop or upper motion, if you will, to the lower left motion bears some similarity. The P bears some construction and form similarity to the P?? below or the specimen Ps. And the extension, the final extension of the sir name bears some similarity with the final extension of the sir name, I don't have it right here, but it's the first known specimen signature at the top left.

Q K-1,2, I believe?

A K-1,2, yes.

Q And that's you comparing Q-1 to K-1 through K-8, correct?

A That is correct.

Q If you compare Q-2 to K-1 through K-8, what similarities do you see between Q-2 and K-1 through K-8?

A Well, for the most part the same.

Q Okay.

A For most part the same.

Q Any differences between Q-1 and Q-2, any similarities that you see in one that you don't see in the other one?
