ORDER

THIS MATTER is before the Court *sua sponte*.

On March 8, 2013, the Plaintiff initiated this action against Defendants Winc Design Limited and Pure Precision Limited. [Doc. 1]. To date, there is nothing in the record to indicate that the Plaintiff has served Defendant Winc Design Limited.

Rule 4(m) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure provides, in pertinent part, as follows:

If a defendant is not served within 120 days after the complaint is filed, the court – on motion or on its own after notice to the plaintiff – must dismiss the action without prejudice against that defendant or

order that service be made within a specified time. But if the plaintiff shows good cause for the failure, the court must extend the time for service for an appropriate period.

Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(m).


The Plaintiff is hereby placed on notice that unless good cause is shown to the Court for its failure to effect service of the Summons and Complaint on Defendant Winc Design Limited within fourteen (14) days from service of this Order, the Plaintiff's action against this Defendant shall be dismissed without prejudice without further order.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Plaintiff shall show good cause within fourteen (14) days of service of this Order for the failure to effect service on the Defendant Winc Design Limited.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that failure of the Plaintiff to respond in writing within fourteen (14) days shall result in a dismissal without prejudice of this action without further order of the Court.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
