JAMES S. GWIN, UNITED STATES DISTRICT JUDGE:

On January 9, 2013, Plaintiff Zayid filed a complaint seeking judicial review of Defendant Commissioner of Social Security's decision to deny him disability insurance benefits and supplemental security income.<sup>1/</sup> Under Local Rule 72.2, the Court referred the petition to Magistrate Judge Kenneth S. McHargh for a Report and Recommendation. On November 19, 2013, Magistrate Judge McHargh issued a report recommending this Court affirm the Commissioner's decision.<sup>2/</sup> The Court **ADOPTS** the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation and **DISMISSES** Plaintiff's complaint.

The Federal Magistrates Act requires a district court to conduct a *de novo* review only of those portions of a Report and Recommendation to which the parties have made an objection.<sup>3/</sup>

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Parties must file any objections to a Report and Recommendation within fourteen days of service.<sup>4/</sup> Failure to object within that time waives a party's right to appeal the magistrate judge's recommendation.<sup>5/</sup> Absent objection, a district court may adopt the Magistrate Judge's report without review.<sup>6/</sup>

In this case, neither party objected to the Magistrate Judge's recommendation. Accordingly, the Court **ADOPTS** in whole Magistrate Judge McHargh's Report and Recommendation and incorporates it fully herein by reference. The Court **DISMISSES** Plaintiff's complaint.
