1. Do you have knowledge of Clifford Amebeck and Bob Fitrakis's participation in any election legal case in Ohio?

Answer: Yes

2. When was this?

Answer: December, 2004 to January, 2005 when the case was dismissed.

3. What is the name of that case?

Answer:

Moss et al, v Bush

4. Were the plaintiffs in the case kept informed as to what was happening in the case and the decisions being made in their names?

Answer: No. After speaking to several petitioners in that case, I realized that they had been given no information regarding that case.

5. What is your opinion of the petitioners' attorneys' legal work, writing, and discovery in Moss et al v Bush?

Answer: Poor. I was extremely concerned regarding what appeared to me, and other attorneys with whom I consulted, to be very low caliber legal work. The petition filed with the Ohio Supreme Court, in the words of Attorney Lillian Ritt, appeared to be "written by a first year law student." Subpoenas issued to Ohio Boards of Election did not comply with Ohio law in that they demanded production of documents in less than the statutorily required period of time. Petitioners' attorneys failed to request a court order shortening time for production of subpoenaed documents. I, and others, attempted to contact petitioners' attorneys regarding this issue. When I spoke on the phone to Arnebeck and Fitrakis' co-counsel, Peter Peckarsky, he verbally attacked me and refused

to discuss this issue. When I personally spoke to Bob Fitrakis regarding the subpoenas, he appeared not to want to speak to me about this problem which was never remedied.

6. What was the outcome of the case?

Answer: Attorneys for the petitioners dismissed the case in early January, 2005 with no consultation with their clients. I was told by petitioner, Evan Davis, that neither he nor his parents, who were also petitioners in Moss, et v Bush, were consulted in any way by their attorneys regarding dismissal of the case.

7. What is your legal background?

I am an "Inactive" member of the California State Bar Association (member number 077831). I am retired after over 22 years as a Staff Attorney for California Superior Courts in San Diego and Sacramento. My resume is attached hereto.
