CARMEN OHIO

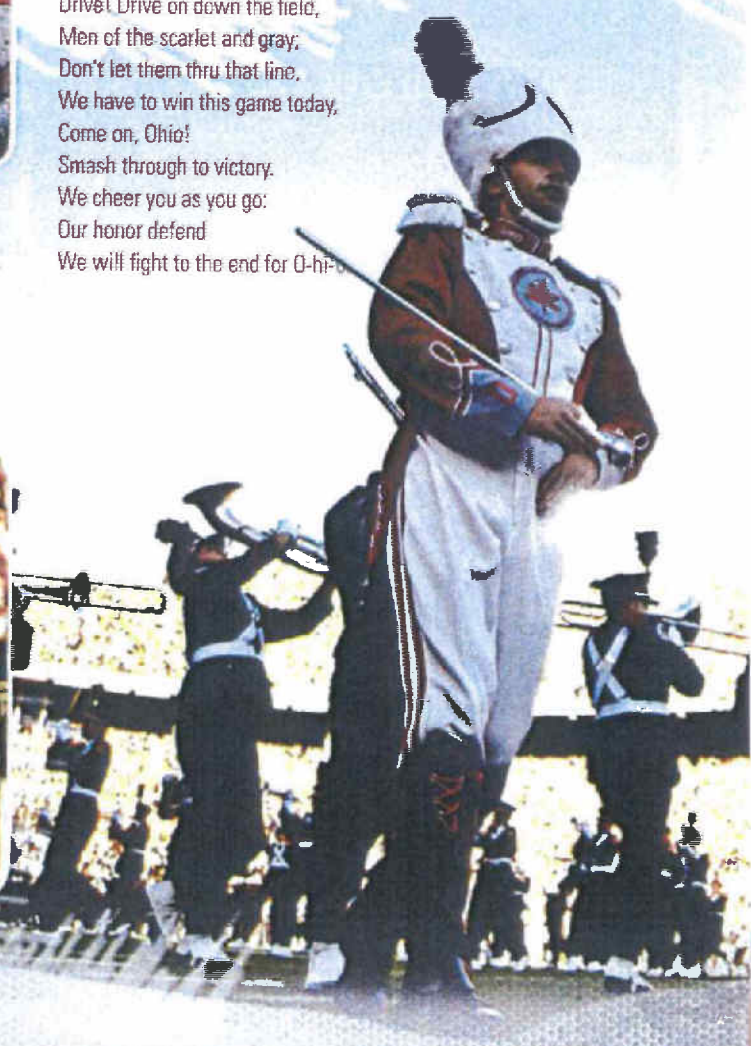
Oh! Come let's sing Ohio's praise,
