ORDER

On June 29, 2012, United States Magistrate Judge Robert E. Bacharach issued a Report and Recommendation in this matter and recommended that the matter be transferred to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Oklahoma. Petitioner Antone Lamandingo Knox was advised of his right to object, see Doc. 28 at 4, and the matter now comes before the Court on Knox's Objection to Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation. See Doc. 29.

A petition seeking a writ of habeas corpus under title 28, section 2241 of the United States Code, such as Knox's Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus ("Petition"), as amended, see Docs. 1, 20, "attacks the execution of a sentence rather than its validity and must be filed in the [judicial] district where the prisoner is confined." Haugh v. Booker, 210 F.3d 1147, 1149 (10th Cir. 2000)(quoting Bradshaw v. Story, 86 F.3d 164, 166 (10th Cir. 1996)). Knox is currently incarcerated in the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma, which is located within the territorial jurisdiction of the Eastern District of Oklahoma; consequently, this Court lacks jurisdiction over Knox's Petition.


"Jurisdictional defects that arise when a suit is filed in the wrong federal district may be cured by transfer under the federal transfer statute, 28 U.S.C. § 1631, which requires . . . [the C]ourt to transfer such an action 'if the transfer is in the interest of justice.'" Haugh, 210 F.3d at 1150 (quotation omitted). This provision has been interpreted in this circuit to provide this Court with discretion to determine whether to transfer the action or to dismiss it without prejudice. E.g., Trujillo v. Williams, 465 F.3d 1210, 1222-23 (10th Cir. 2006).

Despite the objections lodged by Knox, the Court concurs with Magistrate Judge Bacharach's finding that the interest of justice warrants a transfer of Knox's Petition. Accordingly, the Court

(1) ADOPTS the Report and Recommendation [Doc. 28] issued on June 29, 2012;
and

(2) DIRECTS the Clerk of the Court to transfer this matter to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Oklahoma.
