On May 23, 2017, Plaintiff filed an Unopposed Application for Fees Pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act ("EAJA"), 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d), in which the parties agree that Plaintiff should be awarded fees in the amount of \$6,830.51. ECF No. 18.


Accordingly, based on the agreement of the parties, it is hereby ORDERED that attorney fees in the amount of \$6,830.51 shall be awarded to Plaintiff pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412. There are no costs or expenses. The parties agree that attorney fees will be paid to Plaintiff's attorney, subject to verification that plaintiff does not have a debt which qualifies for offset against the awarded fees, pursuant to the Treasury Offset Program as discussed in *Astrue v. Ratliff*, 560 U.S. 586 (2010).

1 - ORDER FOR EAJA FEES

If Plaintiff has no such debt, then the check shall be made out to Plaintiff's attorney, George J. Wall, at Mr. Wall's address: 1336 E. Burnside St., Suite 130, Portland, OR 97132. If Plaintiff has a debt, then the check for any remaining funds after offset of the debt shall be made out to Plaintiff and mailed to Plaintiff's attorney's office at the address stated above.
