ORDER

HERNANDEZ, District Judge:

Magistrate Judge Papak issued a Findings & Recommendation (#22) on January 23, 2018, in which he recommends the Court affirm the Commissioner's decision to deny Plaintiff's application for disability insurance benefits. Magistrate Judge's report. 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1); Dawson v. Marshall, 561 F.3d 930, 932 (9th Cir. 2009); *United States v. Reyna-Tapia*, 328 F.3d 1114, 1121 (9th Cir. 2003) (en banc).

I have carefully considered Plaintiff's objections and conclude there is no basis to modify the Findings & Recommendation. I have also reviewed the pertinent portions of the record de novo and find no other errors in the Magistrate Judge's Findings & Recommendation.
