## **ORDER**

AND NOW this 31st day of January, 2013, upon consideration of the Report and Recommendation of Magistrate Judge Timothy R. Rice (Dkt. It appears that Fluellen was convicted of second-degree murder, as the Report states in all other references to this conviction. Dkt. No. 4. ECF p. 1, 4, 5-7.
