In particular, the Court agrees that the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") improperly discounted the opinion of Plaintiff's treating neurologist, Dr. Gupta, based upon a misreading of the findings of physical examinations, and substituted the ALJ's lay understanding of the meaning of diagnostic tests for the opinion of the treating physician. The Court also agrees that on remand, the ALJ should consider whether to send Plaintiff to a consultative examiner or seek the testimony of a medical expert at the hearing.
