ORDER

This is a <u>pro se</u> Title VII employment discrimination and retaliation case. On December 8, 2016, Magistrate Judge Saporito issued a Report and Recommendation recommending dismissal of this case pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B)(ii) for failure to state a claim, as Plaintiff's complaint failed to allege exhaustion of administrative remedies. - 1. The Court adopts the Report and Recommendation (Doc. No. 6), of Magistrate Judge Saporito;
- 2. Plaintiff's complaint is **DISMISSED** without prejudice;
- 3. Plaintiff shall file an amended complaint within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order;
- 4. Failure to file an amended complaint in accordance with this Order may result in dismissal of this case with prejudice for failure to prosecute; and
