## **MEMORANDUM ORDER**

This case is before the Court on the Report and Recommendation filed by Chief Magistrate Judge Lisa Pupo Lenihan on May 10, 2013. (ECF No. 112.) Judge Lenihan recommended that the Motion for Summary Judgment filed by Defendants Pelzer, McGavitt, Strawn and Washington County (ECF No. 103) be granted. She also recommended that Defendant Sutherland be dismissed from this action for the failure of Plaintiff Megan Hookey ("Plaintiff") to serve her timely in compliance with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(m) and for Plaintiff's failure to prosecute under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(b). file written objections. As of the date of this order, no objections have been filed. As such, after

de novo review of the pleadings and documents in the case, together with the Report and

Recommendation, the following order is entered.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Motion for Summary Judgment filed by

Defendants Pelzer, McGavitt, Strawn and Washington County (ECF No. 103) is **GRANTED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants Sutherland and Pettit are DISMISSED

from this action.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Report and Recommendation dated May 10,

2013, (ECF No. 112), is **ADOPTED** as the opinion of the court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court mark this case CLOSED.

**AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that pursuant to Rule 4(a)(1) of the Federal Rules

of Appellate Procedure, Plaintiff has thirty (30) days to file a notice of appeal as provided by

Rule 3 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure.
