1 MR. KINGSBOM: While we're on the record, I
2 want to put something on the record. Ms. Held, I just
3 wanted to confirm that I gave you a copy of Form
4 SB3-41(606), Tennessee Special Homeowners Policy.

5 MS. HELD: Yes, sir. Thank you.

6 MR. KINGSBOM: And it's not certified. It's
7 just a form that I've been provided.

8 MS. HELD: Certainly.

9 MR. KINGSBOM: The other thing I wanted to
10 confirm is that we did e-mail to you a copy of the
11 electric company records?

12 MS. HELD: Yes, I received those.

13 MR. KINGSBOM: Okay. Thanks. It just helps me
14 to put that kind of stuff on the record so I don't have
15 to send you a letter.

16 MS. HELD: I understand.

17 KIMBERLY ANN HOLLOWAY,
18 called as a witness at the instance of the
19 Insurer, having been first duly sworn, was examined and
20 testified as follows:

21 EXAMINATION

22 BY MR. KINGSBOM:

23 Q. Let's see. Ms. Holloway, right?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. My name is Mark Kinman. I'm an attorney. I

1 represent American National Property & Casualty Company.
 2 We're here today to talk to you about a fire loss that
 3 occurred on September 4, 2010 at the residence where you
 4 were living at that time. What's that address there?
 5 A. 2715 Highway 360, Vance, Tennessee.
 6 Q. Okay. State your full name, please.
 7 A. Kimberly Ann Holloway.
 8 Q. Okay. And what's your date of birth?
 9 A. [REDACTED].
 10 Q. Okay. Do you have your driver's license with
 11 you?
 12 A. Yes. (Witness produces.)
 13 Q. Okay. Thank you. And it's got the address of
 14 2715 Highway 360. And let's see. Your license number is
 15 108341378, issued June 17, 2009. Thank you.
 16 A. Uh-huh.
 17 Q. This is an Examination Under Oath. It's
 18 allowed under the insurance policy. I'm going to ask you
 19 a number of questions, and if you don't understand me,
 20 will you tell me so?
 21 A. Yes.
 22 Q. If you don't hear me, will you tell me that,
 23 too?
 24 A. Yes.
 25 Q. After we're finished the court reporter will

1 A. Yes.
 2 Q. And have you ever been married?
 3 A. Yes.
 4 Q. Who were you married to?
 5 A. Steven Charles Holloway.
 6 Q. And are you divorced?
 7 A. It's been filed, he's been served, and his 30
 8 days has surpassed for counter-filing, so I'm now waiting
 9 just for a court date, for it to be final.
 10 Q. When was that filed? I'm sorry. Where was
 11 that filed?
 12 A. It was -- I've filed twice now against him.
 13 The first was originally filed here in Knox County with
 14 Mark Woods, and then the second time when I had to file,
 15 what's it called when it's uncontested, uncontested
 16 divorce, I filed with a different lawyer.
 17 Q. What county is that?
 18 A. Knox County, as well.
 19 Q. How far did you go in school?
 20 A. I'm sorry?
 21 Q. How far did you go in school?
 22 A. In school, oh, I'm actually currently in
 23 college. I graduated high school and am currently
 24 enrolled.
 25 Q. Where?

1 prepare a transcript of the questions and answers, and
 2 we'll provide you with a copy for you to keep.
 3 A. Okay.
 4 Q. We'll also provide you with the original and
 5 ask you to read it, make sure it's accurate, make any
 6 corrections on a correction sheet that will be attached,
 7 and then sign it and have your signature notarized.
 8 A. Okay.
 9 Q. We'll handle that by sending it to your
 10 attorney, or your mother's attorney. I'm not sure who
 11 you represent, Ms. Held. We'll send it to Margaret Held.
 12 Okay?
 13 A. Okay.
 14 Q. And let her talk to you about getting that
 15 completed. Is there any reason you might have trouble
 16 testifying today?
 17 A. No.
 18 Q. Are you taking any medication that might
 19 affect your ability to tell the truth?
 20 A. No.
 21 Q. Okay. And where do you currently live?
 22 A. I live on Eastern Road, in Knoxville.
 23 Q. Okay. You live with your mom and --
 24 A. Mama Laura.
 25 Q. -- Laura?

1 A. University of Phoenix.
 2 Q. What are you studying?
 3 A. Medical administration.
 4 Q. Tell me about the University of Phoenix. What
 5 sort of program is that?
 6 A. It's an associate's degree. It's all online.
 7 Q. Okay. And do you currently work somewhere?
 8 A. I do.
 9 Q. Where?
 10 A. Y-12 Federal Credit Union.
 11 Q. How long have you been there?
 12 A. It will be four years November, this coming
 13 November.
 14 Q. And what do you do there?
 15 A. I'm an MSCS. That is primarily everything
 16 that you can do at the branch besides mortgages.
 17 Q. When did you first move into 2715 Highway 360?
 18 A. I lived for a brief period when we very first
 19 moved out here. I moved back in after my husband left
 20 me. That was -- it will be two years ago in April. So
 21 I've only lived there, I guess, approximately a
 22 year-and-half or so. April -- it would be two years in
 23 April.
 24 Q. April of 2008?
 25 A. Right, yes.

1 Q. We've talked to both your mother and Laura
 2 about Janice Millsaps, and they've told us about problems
 3 they had had with Janice Millsaps. And I'm not asking
 4 you to tell me what they have told you about their
 5 problems with Janice Millsaps. What I want to ask you
 6 is, have you personally been involved in any adverse
 7 relationships with Janice Millsaps or untoward events or
 8 had happenings?
 9 A. She never really talked to me. She would --
 10 you know, it was more primarily looks. I had an incident
 11 with her early in -- earlier spring with my diabetic
 12 meter going missing when it was delivered to her porch.
 13 And I'm still going through with my company on that. So
 14 that's pretty much the only run-in I've had with her.
 15 Q. Is it fair to say, then, that you have not
 16 personally had any arguments or fights or adverse
 17 encounters with Janice Millsaps?
 18 A. Yes, I would say that would be fair to say.
 19 Q. I understand what you're saying about the
 20 insulin pump, and we heard about that from Laura and your
 21 mother, but were you personally involved with that
 22 incident?
 23 A. No.
 24 Q. Were you ever present when Janice Millsaps
 25 made any threats against anybody?

1 because we were wanting to keep it nice for showings.
 2 Q. When was the downstairs finished so that you
 3 were able to use it?
 4 A. I'm not sure. It was before I had moved in
 5 the second time, but I'm not sure the exact time.
 6 Q. So the basement had been remodeled before you
 7 moved in?
 8 A. Yes.
 9 Q. Was there any remodeling work done after you
 10 moved in?
 11 A. I'm not sure.
 12 Q. Do you have any recollection of any remodeling
 13 work being done in the house after you moved in the
 14 second time?
 15 A. No, I don't -- well, actually, yes, tile work
 16 was put in after I was moved in.
 17 Q. Tile work in which room?
 18 A. Both of the bathrooms.
 19 Q. Okay. Was it ceramic tile?
 20 A. I'm not sure.
 21 Q. Do you recall any other remodeling work
 22 performed after you moved in the second time?
 23 A. I know there was stuff being done, but I'm not
 24 sure exactly what it was and the time that was being
 25 done. I think everything was pretty much remodeled

1 A. No.
 2 Q. Were you ever present when Janice Millsaps
 3 made any pejorative statements about either Laura or your
 4 mother?
 5 A. No.
 6 Q. Okay. Before the fire happened, did you
 7 contribute money to the household?
 8 A. Yes.
 9 Q. How much?
 10 A. I would give \$200 a month, and then I would
 11 purchase groceries of my own, you know, food, or if --
 12 you know, we'd take turns as far as purchasing laundry,
 13 that type of thing. But besides that, no.
 14 Q. You mean laundry detergent?
 15 A. Yeah, laundry detergent.
 16 Q. But if you wanted special snacks or if you
 17 wanted food that you wanted to eat, you would buy your
 18 own?
 19 A. I bought all my own groceries, since
 20 downstairs had a --
 21 Q. Okay. Did you live downstairs.
 22 A. I did.
 23 Q. And did you cook and everything down there?
 24 A. On and off I would sometimes cook downstairs,
 25 sometimes upstairs. I did not use the oven downstairs

1 before I had moved in and things were just being touched
 2 up.
 3 Q. Okay. Do you have any knowledge of the
 4 financial condition of your mother and Laura?
 5 A. No.
 6 Q. Okay. It's not something they would share
 7 with you --
 8 A. No.
 9 Q. -- whether they were in financial distress or
 10 having trouble making payments?
 11 A. No.
 12 Q. Did you pay all of your own bills --
 13 A. Yes.
 14 Q. -- and debts?
 15 A. Yes.
 16 Q. Did your mother or Laura ever have to help you
 17 make your payments?
 18 A. They helped me put tires on my car.
 19 Q. Other than that, did they ever help you make
 20 your payments on your debts or your other expenses?
 21 A. No.
 22 Q. Do you have health insurance?
 23 A. Yes.
 24 Q. Okay. Who is your health insurance with?
 25 A. It is with BlueCross/BlueShield of Tennessee.

1 Q. Okay. Is that through your employer?
 2 A. Yes.
 3 Q. Do you pay that?
 4 A. Yes, out of my check.
 5 Q. Okay. I imagine your employer pays some of
 6 it, too?
 7 A. We just have -- we just get the deduction out
 8 of our check every pay period, so I'm not sure how that
 9 works.
 10 Q. Your insulin, those are quite expensive,
 11 insulin pumps. Did BlueCross pay for that?
 12 A. No. It was actually the insurance I had before
 13 BlueCross. I'm not for certain, but I want to say it was
 14 United Health, and they only paid a portion.
 15 Q. Do you know of anybody else, other than
 16 perhaps Janice Millsaps, that could be a suspect in
 17 causing this fire?
 18 A. No.
 19 Q. Okay. For example, had there been any fights
 20 or altercations or arguments between your mother and
 21 anybody else other than Janice Millsaps that you know of?
 22 A. Not that I'm aware of.
 23 Q. Now about between Laura and anybody other than
 24 Janice Millsaps?
 25 A. Not that I'm aware of.

1 A. His name is Ron Quintana.
 2 Q. I'm sorry?
 3 A. His last name is spelled Q-U-I-N-T-A-N-A.
 4 Q. Okay. Where does he live?
 5 A. He lives in Maryville.
 6 Q. What's his phone number?
 7 A. It's 865-661-3974.
 8 Q. Okay. And where does he work?
 9 A. He works with Tindell's.
 10 Q. Okay. And you said you went to work --
 11 A. Uh-huh.
 12 Q. -- at Y-12 Credit Union?
 13 A. Yes.
 14 Q. Where is that located?
 15 A. It's located on East Lemar Alexander, in
 16 Maryville.
 17 Q. Yeah, I know where that is. And you said we
 18 came home. Who is he?
 19 A. Sorry. I came home.
 20 Q. Okay.
 21 A. I dropped him off and then I came home.
 22 Q. Okay. And you say you got your bags together,
 23 did your packing or whatever?
 24 A. Yes.
 25 Q. You said Jade was going to drop Lora off at

1 Q. What about yourself and other people?
 2 A. No.
 3 Q. You didn't have any enemies that might have
 4 wanted to burn your house?
 5 A. No.
 6 Q. Tell me what you remember about the day of the
 7 fire. Just start from, you know, first thing you
 8 remember doing that day until you found out about the
 9 fire.
 10 A. I took my boyfriend home that morning, went to
 11 work. It was a Saturday, so I worked till noon. We came
 12 home and gathered all of our bags upstairs that we were
 13 taking, and then we were waiting for Lora and her
 14 daughter to come up there. Her daughter Jade was
 15 dropping her off.
 16 Q. That's L-O-R-A, Lora?
 17 A. Yeah, Lora. And we left sometime that
 18 afternoon.
 19 Q. Let me stop you there a second, then I'll tell
 20 you to start up again.
 21 A. Okay.
 22 Q. You said you took your boyfriend home. Had he
 23 spent the night there?
 24 A. He did.
 25 Q. What's his name?

1 the house?
 2 A. Yes.
 3 Q. That's Lora Slack?
 4 A. Yes.
 5 Q. Take it from there. What happened next?
 6 A. We took some pictures of all the luggage we
 7 crammed in the back of the vehicle and we left, we
 8 stopped halfway at a convenience store, checked into the
 9 hotel, got unpacked and situated. We then went out for
 10 dinner and drinks that evening, and that's when I got a
 11 call on my cell phone, I'm not sure the exact time, we
 12 had already been -- we had been walking the streets a
 13 little bit, taking touristy pictures, and it said Lora's
 14 home, or something of that nature, and I thought it was
 15 just her kids calling to check in on her. And when I
 16 answered the phone, I can't remember who it was. It was
 17 one of her children. I want to say it was Matt or Jade.
 18 I can't remember. It was all -- after that it was kind
 19 of scrambled.
 20 I couldn't hear what was being said at first
 21 because there was a band and stuff playing at the bar
 22 that we were at, and so I handed the phone to Lora.
 23 She's the one who actually got the call and heard all
 24 that was being said. She just came to our table and
 25 said, Your house is, you know, burning to the ground.

1 And she -- I just sat at the table. Mom went outside and
 2 started talking to the police and firefighters and
 3 whoever. I'm not sure who else she was talking to, and I
 4 sat with Mom because we were both just --

5 Q. Mom L, who's that?
 6 A. Oh, sorry. My mom's partner, Laura.
 7 Q. Oh, right. I know who you mean.
 8 A. And so Mom and the other Lora went outside,
 9 and she was with her, to help her through that process.
 10 Q. What was the purpose of this trip?
 11 A. I had actually -- I plan all my vacations at
 12 the beginning of the year at work, because if you don't
 13 get them at the beginning you don't get the time. We
 14 were just going to have fun, get away for a girl's
 15 weekend.
 16 Q. You say you have to plan your vacation. Do
 17 you have to let your supervisor know and basically
 18 reserve that time off?
 19 A. We do. We each fill out vacation sheets at
 20 the beginning of the year.
 21 Q. Okay. And you had done that for this time
 22 period?
 23 A. Yes.
 24 Q. How long had you planned to be gone?
 25 A. We were going to be there Saturday, Sunday,

1 certain.
 2 Q. What part of town was it in?
 3 A. It was close to downtown. It wasn't too far
 4 from the downtown area.
 5 Q. Do you know what street it was on?
 6 A. I don't.
 7 Q. Okay. And then you-all went to the Wildhorse
 8 Saloon?
 9 A. Yes. We walked -- we went to the parking
 10 garage, parked, and went there.
 11 Q. Did you walk there or take your car?
 12 A. We drove there and parked in a parking garage
 13 and walked there.
 14 Q. Where is the Wildhorse Saloon in Nashville?
 15 A. It's on the main strip down there.
 16 Q. Second Avenue?
 17 A. I don't know the exact street name. It's --
 18 Q. I think there's Second Avenue or Second
 19 Street, which is kind of a busy area.
 20 A. I'm not --
 21 Q. Does that ring a bell?
 22 A. I'm not certain.
 23 Q. Okay.
 24 A. I was drinking a little bit.
 25 Q. Do you know approximately what time you got to

1 Monday, and I believe we were -- I can't remember if we
 2 were coming back Tuesday.
 3 Q. And did you plan on taking some more time off
 4 or were you going to go on back to work after Tuesday?
 5 A. I was going back to work.
 6 Q. So the amount of time you had reserved off
 7 would have been Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday?
 8 A. From what I remember. I don't remember the
 9 exact. It was three or four days.
 10 Q. Who was your supervisor at that time?
 11 A. It's Kim Minstolo. She's still currently the
 12 branch manager.
 13 Q. Is she the person that would have custody of
 14 the vacation sheet?
 15 A. Yes.
 16 Q. What do you call that piece of paper that you
 17 would have filled out and --
 18 A. I don't know if it's really called anything.
 19 She hands them out every year at the beginning. They're
 20 just vacation requests maybe.
 21 Q. Is it like a form?
 22 A. It's a form you fill out, yes.
 23 Q. So when you arrived in Nashville you-all went
 24 to a hotel. Do you remember the name of the hotel?
 25 A. I believe it was Holiday Inn. I'm not

1 the Wildhorse Saloon?
 2 A. It was already dark outside. I would say it
 3 was probably -- I know it was evening. It wasn't late
 4 night.
 5 Q. And how long were you at the Wildhorse Saloon
 6 before you received the phone call?
 7 A. Probably about 20 -- approximately 30 minutes,
 8 maybe 40.
 9 Q. How long did you stay at the Wildhorse Saloon
 10 after the phone call?
 11 A. Probably an hour to an hour-and-a-half.
 12 Q. And when that phone call that came in, was it
 13 on your cell phone?
 14 A. It was.
 15 Q. Do you have your cell phone records?
 16 A. I don't. I get my stuff all online, so I
 17 don't know. I could call Sprint and ask them.
 18 Q. Would you do that, call them and see if you
 19 can get the cell phone records for September 4 and 5 of
 20 2010?
 21 A. Do I need that right now?
 22 Q. Your attorney's going to make a note of that.
 23 I guess she'll remind you later.
 24 A. Okay.
 25 Q. Approximately what time of day do you think it

1 was when you left the Wildhorse Saloon?
 2 A. It was, I would think -- I think it was before
 3 midnight.
 4 Q. And it was you, Laura, and Lora -- trying
 5 to -- Lora Black --
 6 A. Correct.
 7 Q. -- your mom. That's --
 8 A. Four.
 9 Q. Four. Okay. Did you-all meet anybody there?
 10 A. No.
 11 Q. Did you have anybody else in your party at
 12 that time?
 13 A. No.
 14 Q. What did you do after you received the phone
 15 call, while you were still there at the Wildhorse Saloon?
 16 A. I stayed with Mom. Like I said, Mom was on
 17 the phone outside, with different people needing to talk
 18 to her, trying to handle everything. We had all of our
 19 -- we went ahead and had all of our food -- I believe we
 20 had just placed our order, all of our food had been
 21 brought back to us, so -- and we just took it to go,
 22 actually, most of it.
 23 Q. Did you have any more drinks?
 24 A. Yes.
 25 Q. How many more did you have?

1 A. I would say between three to five.
 2 Q. What were you drinking?
 3 A. There are these little-bitty shots that you
 4 could order off the menu, a fruity type.
 5 Q. Do you remember the name of them?
 6 A. I don't.
 7 Q. And how many did Mom have?
 8 A. Probably pretty close to that.
 9 Q. Okay. And what about your mother?
 10 A. Probably the same. We were ordering the same
 11 rounds, from what I remember.
 12 Q. Okay. And then after approximately an
 13 hour-and-a-half you-all left and went back to the hotel?
 14 A. Correct.
 15 Q. What did you do when you got there?
 16 A. We were debating on whether we were all going
 17 to -- you know, who was going to stay and who was going
 18 to go back. Mom had -- I guess she didn't drink like we
 19 did, because she decided to drive back, and the rest of
 20 us were staying because we had drunk.
 21 Q. How long did you stay at the hotel before your
 22 mother left to drive back?
 23 A. We were there probably a couple of hours. She
 24 didn't leave until, I want to say it was in the morning,
 25 I want to believe it was 1:00 or 2:00. We were just so

1 upset.
 2 Q. And I guess she went by herself, is that
 3 correct?
 4 A. She did.
 5 Q. Did she drive the Element?
 6 A. She did.
 7 Q. Okay. And then what did you-all do the next
 8 day?
 9 A. We were trying to get a rental car, but it was
 10 a holiday.
 11 Q. Was it Labor Day, September 4th?
 12 A. Yes.
 13 Q. That's the only holiday I know around there.
 14 A. Yes. I always get Labor Day and Memorial --
 15 we were having a hard time getting a taxi service that
 16 was open, they had already been rented out, so Mom and
 17 I ended up calling a taxi that drove us to the airport
 18 and we rented a rental car from there, went back to the
 19 hotel and picked up Lora Black.
 20 Q. The fire was -- I was trying to see what day
 21 of the week September 4 was on. Do you recall that?
 22 A. It had to have been Saturday because it was
 23 the night we left and I worked half a day that day.
 24 Q. Okay. I got it. September 4 was Saturday,
 25 September 5 was Sunday, September 6 was Monday, September

1 6 was Labor Day. So the day after the fire was September
 2 5, right?
 3 A. Correct.
 4 Q. And that's when you-all were trying to get a
 5 ride to the airport to get a rental car.
 6 A. Right.
 7 Q. Other than looking for a taxi to get you to
 8 the airport to rent a car, did do you anything else on
 9 Sunday?
 10 A. Yes. We -- after we got the rental car we
 11 went downtown.
 12 Q. What did you do downtown?
 13 A. I wanted a Christmas ornament.
 14 Q. So did you go somewhere and buy a Christmas
 15 ornament?
 16 A. I did. It was one of the souvenir shops.
 17 MS. HEND: Labor Day weekend?
 18 A. I have a thing for buying Christmas ornaments
 19 where I go. I said, if I'm going to be here, I'm going
 20 to at least get a Christmas ornament and a tee-shirt.
 21 Q. Did you buy a tee-shirt?
 22 A. It says Jack Lives Here, or something like
 23 that. It's a Jack Daniels tee-shirt.
 24 Q. Did you-all do anything else before you
 25 started back to Venoze?

1 A. We ate down -- it was on the same strip, it
2 was a little -- like a pika parlor type.
3 Q. Did you do anything else?
4 A. No.
5 Q. Okay. And then approximately what time of day
6 on Sunday did you start back to Vance?
7 A. I believe it was mid-afternoon, probably
8 around the 2:00 to 3:00 area.
9 Q. Did you make any stops between Nashville and
10 Knoxville or Vance?
11 A. I don't remember.
12 Q. And when you came back to Vance -- where did
13 you go when you came back?
14 A. We went to Lora's house, to drop her off.
15 Q. Lora Black?
16 A. Lora Black.
17 Q. Where does she live in relation to the house
18 that burned?
19 A. She lives down the -- well, we're up on a
20 hill. Down -- if you're facing the front of our
21 property, she lives down to the right.
22 Q. Is that within 100 yards of your house?
23 A. I'm not sure. I'm not mathematically
24 inclined.
25 Q. Couple of football fields?

1 A. I'm not sure.
2 Q. I mean, like a month before, two weeks before
3 the fire?
4 A. It was probably several months before.
5 Q. Why did you do that?
6 A. To try to depersonalize.
7 Q. Okay. Why did you want to depersonalize?
8 A. Because BRV says that's the way to sell a
9 house.
10 Q. So at that point y'all were working on selling
11 the house?
12 A. Yes.
13 Q. When was the first time there was any
14 discussion between you and your mother or you and Laura
15 about the possibility of selling the house?
16 A. It was before I got married, actually, because
17 we were going to put it on the market, and we waited
18 because I wanted to have my reception there.
19 Q. Okay. When was that you got married?
20 A. I know this sounds bad, but I really don't
21 remember.
22 Q. Can you give me a year?
23 A. I want to say it was 2007, but it may be 2008.
24 Q. Why was there a discussion at that time about
25 selling the house? What was the reason?

1 A. Yes, yeah, she is within that, yes.
2 Q. So you took Lora home, and then where did you
3 go?
4 A. We went to -- we were staying with people up
5 in Tellico Plains. It was actually the first time I had
6 ever met the woman, Carol, but I'd met Ky before.
7 Q. Where do they live in Tellico Plains?
8 A. I don't know the name. I only stayed there
9 two nights.
10 Q. And then where did you stay?
11 A. I stayed with my boyfriend. It was too far of
12 a drive.
13 Q. Have you talked with anybody that knows what
14 caused this fire?
15 A. No.
16 Q. Do you have any idea what caused the fire?
17 A. No.
18 Q. Okay. Did you have anything to do with
19 causing the fire?
20 A. No.
21 Q. Did you remove anything from the house during
22 the 60 days before the fire?
23 A. I did remove some shot glasses and some
24 personal pictures.
25 Q. When did you do that?

1 A. I'm not sure. They were remodeling it, going
2 to sell it, make a profit.
3 Q. You're aware that it was listed for sale at
4 the time of the fire, right?
5 A. Yes.
6 Q. Why was it being sold at that time?
7 A. We were wanting to possibly fix up the other
8 house and try to go on travel assignments after I
9 graduated, possibly.
10 Q. Is that information you got from your mother?
11 Is that discussions you had had with your mother?
12 A. It was just dreaming type stuff.
13 Q. Okay. But when you say you were dreaming, was
14 that discussions you had had with your mother and Laura,
15 about that possibility?
16 A. Yes.
17 Q. Okay. The other house was at 316 Depot
18 Street?
19 A. I don't know the address, but I know that's
20 the street.
21 Q. So the idea was that maybe you'd fix that
22 house up and use it as a home base and go on travel
23 assignments?
24 A. Correct. They were going to make that house
25 more to the floor plan that they wanted.

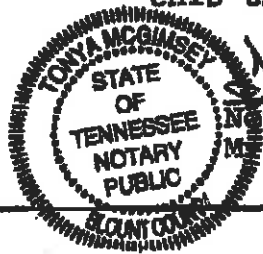
