## ORDER

On January 2, 2014, United States Magistrate Judge William B. Carter filed a Report and Recommendation (Doc. 19) pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1) and Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 72(b). Magistrate Judge Carter recommended that Plaintiff's Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings (Doc. 15) be **DENIED**, Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment (Doc. 17) be **GRANTED**, a judgment be entered pursuant to Rule 58 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure **AFFIRMING** the Commissioner's decision denying benefits to Plaintiff, and this action be **DISMISSED**.

Plaintiff has filed no objections to the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation.<sup>1</sup> Nevertheless, the Court has reviewed *de novo* the record in this matter, and it agrees with the Magistrate Judge's well-reasoned conclusions.

Accordingly, the Court ACCEPTS and ADOPTS Magistrate Judge Carter's findings of fact and conclusions of law. Plaintiff's Motion for Judgment on the

Pleadings (Doc. 15) is **DENIED**, Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment (Doc. 17) is **GRANTED**, the decision of the Commissioner is **AFFIRMED**, and this action is hereby **DISMISSED**.
