MOTION FOR A NEW TRIAL PURSUANT TO FED.R.CIV.P., 59(a)(2)

COMES NOW THE PLAINTIFF, Danny Ray Meeks, <u>pro se</u>, as an indigent, incarcerated litigant and pursuant to <u>Fed.
