## SEALED ORDER

Pending before the Court is Plaintiff's Motion for Clarification (Docket No. 14). Plaintiff seeks clarification of the Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO") entered by the undersigned on May 19, 2009 (Docket No. 12). The Motion is granted.

According to the applicable statute, any materials seized by Plaintiff pursuant to the TRO "shall be taken into the custody of the Court." 15 U.S.C. § 1116(d)(7). Goods seized and stored by Plaintiff shall be deemed in the custody of the Court and shall be stored by Plaintiff, in identifiable containers, at Plaintiff's expense and Plaintiff's risk of loss, at a location of Plaintiff's choice. Plaintiff shall notify the Court of the location of the seized goods and the names of all persons having access thereto.
