MEMORANDUM ORDER OVERRULING PETITIONER'S OBJECTIONS AND ADOPTING THE MAGISTRATE JUDGE'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

Petitioner Brandon J. Gilbert, a federal prisoner confined in Beaumont, Texas, brought this petition for writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241.

The court ordered that this matter be referred to the Honorable Keith F. Giblin, United States Magistrate Judge, at Beaumont, Texas, for consideration pursuant to applicable laws and orders of this court. The magistrate judge has submitted a Report and Recommendation of United States Magistrate Judge. The magistrate judge recommends denying the petition.

The court has received and considered the Report and Recommendation of United States Magistrate Judge, along with the record and the pleadings. Petitioner filed objections to the magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation.

The court has conducted a *de novo* review of the objections in relation to the pleadings and the applicable law. *See* FED. R. CIV. P. 72(b). After careful consideration, the court concludes the objections are without merit.

ORDER

A subsequent sentencing judge must be presumed to know how sentences will be calculated, or this court would become involved in endless review of other court's judgments.

Petitioner's objections are OVERRULED. The findings of fact and conclusions of law of the magistrate judge are correct and his report is ADOPTED. A final judgment will be entered in this case in accordance with the magistrate judge's recommendation.
