(1) Producing Documents or Electronically Stored Information. These procedures apply to producing documents or electronically stored information:

(A) Documents. A person responding to a subpoem to produce documents must form as they are kept in the ordinary course of business or must organize and label them to correspond to the categories in the dam

(B) Form for Producing Electronically Stored Information Not Specified. If a subposess does not specify a form for producing electronically stored information, the person responding must produce it in a form or forms in which it is ordinarily instintatiand or in a le ferme er fo

(C) Electronically Stored Information Produced in Only One Form. The person ig need not produce the same electronically stored information in more than one form.

(D) Inaccessible Electronically Stored Information. The person responding need not responsing near not proude or same varieties to the control of the person responsible Electronically Stored information. The person responsible provide discovery of electronically stored information from sources that the person identifies as not reasonably accessible because of under burden or cost. On motion to compel discovery of or a protective order, the person responding must show that the information is not reasonably accessable because of under our cost. If that showing is made, the court may nonetheless order discovery from each sources if the requesting party shows good came, considering the limitations of Rule 26(b)(2)(C). The court may specify conditions for the discovery.
