Action on: Deposition Questions

The case is assigned to United States Magistrate Judge John Love.

The Court held a Hotline hearing between the above named parties to resolve a dispute regarding the scope of questioning during a deposition. Pursuant to a previous Order (Doc. No. 548), Google produced a witness for deposition to testify as to allegedly non-infringing code implemented by Google. Plaintiff argued that certain questions regarding Google's performance testing should be answered. Counsel for Google contended such questions were outside the limited scope of the Court's Order.

After hearing argument, the Court overruled Google's objections to the line of testing questioning, making clear that such ruling did not preclude a challenge to the admissibility of the deponent's answers. **So ORDERED and SIGNED this 29th day of March, 2011.**
