# EOLAS' UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO RESPOND TO MOVING DEFENDANTS' MOTION TO TRANSFER TO THE U.S. DISTRICT COURT FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF CALIFORNIA PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. § 1404(a)

Plaintiff Eolas Technologies Incorporated ("Eolas") files this unopposed motion for extension of time for Eolas to respond to Moving Defendants' Motion to Transfer to the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1404(a) (hereinafter "Moving Defendants' Motion"). I.

On February 10, 2010 Moving Defendants filed their Motion (Dkt. 214). On February 11, 2010 CDW Corporation joined the Moving Defendants' Motion (*see* Dkt. 215) as did JPMorgan Chase & Co. (*see* Dkt. 216).

Per the Court's Order on February 17, 2010 (Dkt. 219) the current deadline for Eolas to respond to the Moving Defendants' Motion is March 11, 2010. Eolas respectfully requests leave to extend this deadline by one week, from March 11, 2010 until March 18, 2010. Neither Moving Defendants nor Non-Moving Defendants oppose this extension.
