**DECLARATION OF KEVIN NOLAN IN SUPPORT OF

I, Kevin Nolan, declare as follows:

1. I am the Senior Director of Worldwide eBusiness of Sonic Solutions LLC. I submit this Declaration in support of defendants' Motion to Transfer Venue Under Rule 28 U.S.C. § 1404(a). I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this Declaration acquired through my work experience at Sonic Solutions LLC.

2. Sonic Solutions ("Sonic") was a company organized under the laws of California with its principal place of business located in Novato, California. In 2011, Sonic was merged with and into a subsidiary of Sonic Holdings, Inc., which is a subsidiary of Rovi Corporation. Sonic is now Sonic Solutions LLC, a California limited liability company, and is a wholly owned subsidiary of sonic Holdings, Inc.


3. I am aware that the Plaintiffs Uniloc USA, Inc. and Uniloc Singapore Private Limited (collectively, "Uniloc") allege that Sonic directly and/or indirectly infringes U.S. Patent No. 5,490,216, "by, among other things, making, using, offering for sale, selling and/or importing a system, device and/or method for reducing software piracy, reducing casual copying

and/or reducing the unauthorized use of software, including without limitation Sonic's product activation system and process that permit customers to activate software distributed by Sonic's Roxio division, such as DVDit 6 Pro."

4. Sonic has offered for sale and has sold, prior to the filing of the plaintiffs' complaint on September 14, 2010, accused products, including DVDit Pro products, in Rhode Island.
