**ORDER ACCEPTING FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND

Pending before the Court are a pair of Plaintiff Lisa Oppenhammer’s motions to amend or alter the judgment. (Docs. 13, 15). The United States Magistrate Judge made findings, conclusions, and a recommendation in this case. (Docs. 14, 16). Magistrate Judge Irma Carrillo Ramirez recommends denying each motion. Oppenhammer objected to Judge Ramirez’s recommendations. Oppenhammer is requesting that the Court “correct a mistake arising from oversight.”¹ The District Court reviewed *de novo* those portions of the proposed findings, conclusions, and recommendation to which objection was made, and reviewed the remaining proposed findings, conclusions, and recommendation for plain error.
