**APPELLANT TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION'S

NOW COMES the Texas Historical Commission (“Commission”) filing its Unopposed Motion to Dismiss Appeal and would show the Court the following in support thereof:

Pursuant to FED. R. APP. P. 42, an Appellant may dismiss an appeal on terms agreed by the parties or fixed by the Court. Subsequent to the filing of the Notice of Appeal by the Commission, the District Court issued Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Final Judgment dismissing Mr. Smith’s claims on April 27, 2009. The Commission filed a Motion for Extension of Time to file its brief on May 8, 2009, which this Court denied by Order dated May 14, 2009.
