I recently sent you an e-mail informing you that Joanie Bingham (801-932-5812), assistant to SCO CEO Darl McBride, had been tasked by Darl to obtain copies of the contracts whereby Novell acquired UNIX System Laboratories.

Today Dave Wright and I spoke with Darl. He wants the any Novell documents that help give the history of SCO's rights to UNIX. He wants this information to support possible efforts by SCO to assert claims relating to infringing uses of SCO UNIX libraries by end users of Linux. As Novell still receives more than \$8 million each year from retained revenue streams for old versions of UNIX, Darl suggested that SCO's efforts may lead to Novell receiving greater revenues.

## I advised Dari that:

- 1. Novell carefully considers any request for information in support of a third party's litigation activities; and
- 2. As he expressed a specific interest in agreements between Novell and UNIX System Laboratories, to the extent any such documents are not publicly available through EDGAR, they would probably be subject to confidentiality agreements.

Darl asked if he could "start with" a copy of the agreements between Novell and SCO.
