Some time ago, I sent an email to you with some information and guidance about data requests from a company called SpotCrime.com. I wanted to provide an update to you and ask that you <u>please share this with your legal department</u> as well.

Last Friday, we filed a lawsuit in Federal Court in Utah against ReportSee, which owns SpotCrime.com. The suit alleges that SpotCrime.com has been willfully and repeatedly misappropriating data from CrimeReports.com and misrepresenting law enforcement agencies' obligations under open records laws. After meeting with resistance from the company to refrain, we are now asking the court to issue an injunction to prevent these alleged activities from continuing.
