Leslee, we've only talked with a handful of agencies about this issue, but all of them have made the same key points. They are basically:

- CrimeReports.com is simply a vendor to the police department to make crime information available to the public. The agency is under no legal obligation to make the data public as a continuous feed but chooses to do so.
- CrimeReports.com provides free, unfettered access to the agency's crime data. The agency views this as fulfilling requirements under open records laws.
- As a vendor to the public, CrimeReports.com is under specific contractual obligations, including (among others) 1) to keep the agency's records up to date; 2) to provide free access to all data; and 3) to not allow advertising.
- If SpotCrime would like to become the vendor to the agency, we would gladly review your proposal.

I hope this helps. I will also reach out to the SLC Police Department and San Jose Police Departments to see if I can get copies of their responses.
