Service of process on current government employees may be effected via authorized agent. If any of the named defendants are no longer employed by the State or County or the State or County are not authorized to accept service for any of these individuals, more information must be obtained from the State or County to complete service. Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that: If the State or County is unable to accept service of process for the defendants identified above, the State or County shall disclose to the United States Marshals Service any information in its records that may help in identifying, locating and completing service of process upon the named defendants. Such information shall include, but is not limited to, the defendants' full names and any known aliases, dates of birth, Social Security numbers, driver's license numbers, all previous addresses, and last known addresses on file. The U.S. Marshal shall take all necessary measures to safeguard any personal information provided by the State or County to ensure that it is not disclosed to anyone other than the U.S. Marshals Service or Court officers.
