Personal profiles on the Web captured media interest this week, with a piece about identity management in the Wall Street Journal and blogger buzz about Facebook's new profile design. OpenSocial partners, both old and new, also made news.

As of 7/17:

*Hot topics*

- Jason Fry at the Wall Street Journal made a case for creating personal homepages. First, with phone landlines disappearing and no central database of cellphone numbers, homepages help users contact people they don't already know. Second, users can maintain personal homepages, whether these are on social networks or traditional webpages, to "defend and define" their own online identities.

- Facebook's redesigned profile is expected to roll out this week. According to Nick O'Neill, one new feature may indicate that Facebook is being more lenient with personal data: apps can now access user data, such as their user id, first and last name, timezone, birthday, gender, and region affiliations, without active sessions. - Twitter revealed that they have, in fact, acquired search engine Summize. Roger Smith at InformationWeek predicts that the Summize service may eventually become a revenue generation mechanism for Twitter, and Michael Arrington published a video of his interview with Twitter co-founder, Evan Williams. Williams provided additional background on the deal and what's in store for Twitter.

*Bloggers on OpenSocial*

Lycos's launched a new Web publishing platform, Webon.com, and announced plans to support OpenSocial on the site. Dan Kosak, Lycos' CTO, was quoted saying:

"We picked OpenSocial because it was the most open standard with the most weight behind it to create this type of container," Kosak said. "Facebook is really leading the world right now as far as the applications themselves, but as far as containers, the things that the social gadgets get into, OpenSocial is really king of the hill."

To promote its platform in China, Japan, Korea, and India, OpenSocial container MySpace will host TheGame08, a pan-Asian contest for developers to create innovative new social apps.

Yahoo also shared future plans for Yahoo! Groups, which include product review tools, wanted boards, address books, and event planners. CNet's Stephen Shankland speculated that integration of OpenSocial applications would be a natural fit in this context
