Robert Pharoah Howard, proceeding <u>pro se</u>, filed a civil rights complaint, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. By order entered July 2, 2013, the court directed plaintiff to submit within 10 days from the date of the order a signed Consent to Fee form. Plaintiff was advised that failure to comply would result in dismissal of this action without prejudice.

More than 10 days have elapsed, and plaintiff has failed to comply with the described conditions because he has failed to return the executed Consent to Fee form. Accordingly, the court dismisses the action without prejudice and strikes the case from the active docket of the court.
