William J. Butler, a Virginia inmate proceeding <u>prose</u>, filed a motion to vacate a void state-court criminal judgment because the Commonwealth of Virginia, as an "illegal vigilante state government," lacked subject matter jurisdiction to prosecute him. The court construed the motion as a petition for a writ of habeas corpus, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254, and conditionally filed the action. Butler thereafter objected to the court's construction as a § 2254 habeas petition. Accordingly, the court treats the motion to vacate as Butler requests and dismisses it without prejudice because the court lacks jurisdiction to review his state-court criminal judgment via the motion to vacate.¹
