Wilver Lopez, proceeding <u>prose</u>, filed a civil rights complaint, pursuant to <u>Bivens v. Six</u> <u>Unknown Named Agents of Fed. Bureau of Narcotics, 403 U.S. 388 (1971).</u> By Order entered November 10, 2016, the court directed plaintiff to submit within twenty days from the date of the Order a statement of assets, an inmate account form, and a certified copy of plaintiff's trust fund account statement for the six-month period immediately preceding the filing of the complaint, obtained from the appropriate prison official of each prisoner at which plaintiff is or was confined during that six-month period as well as an executed verified statement form. Plaintiff was advised that a failure to comply would result in dismissal of this action without prejudice.

More than 20 days have elapsed, and plaintiff has failed to comply with the described conditions. Accordingly, the court dismisses the action without prejudice and strikes the case from the active docket of the court. Plaintiff may refile the claims in a separate action once plaintiff is prepared to comply with the noted conditions.
