# **MEMORANDUM OPINION**

Jamal Daniels, a Virginia inmate proceeding <u>pro se</u>, filed a petition for a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254. By the Order entered on March 29, 2017, the court, <u>inter</u> <u>alia</u>, informed Petitioner that he is required to pay the \$5.00 filing fee or apply to proceed <u>in</u> <u>forma pauperis</u> and granted him ten days to resolve the outstanding filing fee. The Order advised Petitioner that his failure to respond would result in dismissal of the petition without prejudice.

Petitioner has not communicated with the court since the Order entered on March 29, 2017. Because the time allowed to comply has expired and Petitioner has not complied, this action is dismissed without prejudice. Based upon my finding that Petitioner has not made the requisite substantial showing of a denial of a constitutional right as required by 28 U.S.C. § 2253(c) and <u>Slack v. McDaniel</u>, 529 U.S. 473, 484 (2000), a certificate of appealability is denied.
