6	he accepted a two-week extension. With that additional time, Impulse
7	still failed to meet its discovery obligations per FRCP 37 (a) (2) (3) (4).
8	At the status conference in the Fall of 2005, Impulse asked this Court
9	for 3+ additional months for discovery. It has squandered this time by
10	not seeking any discovery of this (or other) third party defendants and
11	will likely petition this Court for still more time.

13	Third Party Defendant's Motion to Compel is pursuant to FRCP 37(a)(2
14	(3)(4). Impulse has failed to make the required Rule 26 disclosures to
15	the undersigned. Further, Impulse has provided evasive, incomplete
16	disclosure, answer, or response to discovery propounded by the
17	undersigned.

19	Third party Defendant asks the Court to award Sanctions per FRCP
20	37(a)(4) in an amount equal to or greater than the Sanctions demanded
21	by Impulse of Plaintiff. Or, in the alternative, simply require/order
22	compliance with the rules.

Notwithstanding the foregoing 4 objections, Impulse is in possession of evidence, in the form of Mr. 5 Gordon's Initial Disclosures in a related action against Commonwealth 6 Marketing Group brought by Mr. Gordon, which evidence may 7 ultimately prove that Mr. Gordon instructed Robert Pritchett to use the 8 gordonworks.com domain to actively and affirmatively solicit 9 commercial emails. 10 Interrogatory No 18: 11 12 What documentary evidence exists of an alleged scheme to solicit 13 emails? 14 15 Response: 16 17 Impulse asserts the Ambiguity, Irrelevancy and Overbreadth 18 Objections. Interrogatory No. 18 is ambiguous as to what scheme Mr. 19 Pritchett refers. The information sought will not lead to the discovery of 20 admissible evidence. Felix A. Thillett, Inc. v.
