13 Defendant filed a motion to remand pursuant to sentence six of 42 U.S.C.

16 proceed before a magistrate judge. ECF No. 7.

18 After consideration,

19 **IT IS ORDERED** that Defendant's motion for remand pursuant to sentence  
20 six, **ECF No. 11, is granted.**

21 This matter is remanded for further administrative proceedings pursuant to  
22 sentence six of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g). Upon remand, the Administrative Law Judge  
23 will hold another hearing and issue a new decision. This Court retains jurisdiction

1 pending further administrative development of the record pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §  
2  
3 405(g).
