19	Court's minute order of November 8, 2010 (Dkt. No. 15), as a non-dispositive motion. The	
20	government's Motion to Dismiss Walker's Complaint (Dkt. No. 20), while filed in the wake of	
21	Petitioner's own motion and purportedly in response to that motion, is a 17-page document with	
22	all the hallmarks (length, noting date, caption) of a dispositive motion.	
23	LR 7(e)(4) sets the page limits on non-dispositive motions at 12 pages for opening and	
24	responsive briefs. The briefing schedule on Petitione	r's motion is hereby revised as follows:

1	• The United States will file its response (not to exceed 12 pages) by no later than	
2	December 14, 2010.	
3	• Petitioner's motion is re-noted to December 20, 2010 and her reply brief (not to	
4	exceed 6 pages) will be due no later than that date.	
5	The government's motion to dismiss is stricken. If, following the ruling on Petitioner's	
6	motion, the United States still believes that such a motion is in order, Respondent is free to re-	
7	file it.
