RESTRAINING ORDER 14 15 This matter comes before the Court on Plaintiff BP West Coast Products, LLC's 16 ("BP"), motion for a temporary restraining order (Dkt. 5). 17 On August 12, 2011, BP filed a complaint against Defendants alleging breach of 18 contract, federal trademark infringement, common law trademark infringement, unfair 19 competition, trademark dilution, and violation of the Washington Consumer Protection 20 21 Act. Dkt. 1. BP also filed a motion for temporary restraining order. Dkt. 2. BP's 22 attorney, K. Michael Fandel, declares that he has communicated the filing of the instant 23 action and motion for a temporary restraining order to the attorney representing 24 Defendants in a separate action. Dkt. 5, Declaration of K. Michael Fandel, ¶ 2. Mr. 25 Fandel argues that the Court should not require additional notice because Defendants are 26 presently causing damage and irreparable harm. *Id.* ¶ 3. 27 28

A court may only issue a temporary restraining order without notice to the other party based on certain facts and clear showings. Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b)(1). In this case, BP has failed to meet its burden for the issuance of extraordinary relief without notice and/or an opportunity to be heard by the adverse party.

Therefore, it is hereby **ORDERED** that BP's motion for a temporary restraining to be issued without notice is **DENIED** and the Court will note the motion for further consideration on August 22, 2011. The Court directs BP to make all reasonable efforts to give Defendants notice of this action, the motion for temporary restraining order, this order, and the noting date for the motion.
