14	Plaintiff Deborah Murphy filed a motion to proceed in forma pauperis (IFP) in this civil
15	matter (Dkt. 1), while plaintiff Aaron Murphy failed to submit an IFP application. The Court
16	would ordinarily require the submission of a separate application for Aaron Murphy in order to
17	provide a complete picture of financial eligibility. However, in this case, the Court finds the
18	information from Deborah Murphy sufficient to render a determination.
19	Deborah Murphy's application reveals that she earns a net monthly salary of \$3,800.00
20	has monthly expenses totaling \$3,350.00, and has over \$800.00 available in checking and
21	savings accounts, as well as \$19,000.00 in a company retirement plan. While her monthly
22	expenses approach the amount of her income, it remains that she appears to have the funds

available to pay the filing fee in this matter. As such, the Court concludes plaintiff Deborah Murphy does not financially qualify for IFP status. The Court, therefore, recommends the IFP application be DENIED. This action should proceed only if plaintiff pays the \$400 filing fee within thirty (30) days after entry of the Court's Order adopting this Report and Recommendation.
