No. 1115. The Court has considered the Parties' pleadings and the 18 Court's file, including the Court's most recent Order on Good Cause Exceptions (GCEs) at Dkt. 19 No. 1135, as well as information provided to the Court at the most recent status hearing held in 20 this matter. Accordingly, and with the Court being fully advised, the Court does hereby: 21 **ORDER** 22 1) The Department may file motions with this Court to request reductions in fines owed 23 for GCEs. Requests for such reductions in fines may look back in time, but not more 24 than six months. The Department is no longer bound by the one month time limit at 25 Dkt. No. 1115 at 6. 26

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1	a. These motions may be brought to seek either system wide audit type
2	accounting adjustments, or patient level adjustments to fines for good cause.
3	b. These motions are not necessary for the Department's regular monthly fine
4	reporting and adjustments made through that process and as data settles.
5	c. The Parties shall meet and confer prior to these motions being filed, and the
6	motions shall indicate for each claimed GCE that Plaintiffs have been
7	consulted and whether Plaintiffs agree that the Court's criteria for GCE have
8	been met.
9	2) Notwithstanding this six month look back limitation and recognizing that some
10	requests for reductions in fines have been pending before this Court, the Department
11	may do a one-time extended look back, and request reductions in fines going back to
12	January of 2024.
13	3) The Department must include Court-approved reductions in fines in subsequent
14	monthly fines reporting declarations, so that these amounts may be reduced to
15	Judgement along with month fines amounts.
16	4) This Order terminates Defendants' Motion for Reconsideration (Dkt. No. 1118) and
17	Joint Motion For Approval of Settlement Agreement (Dkt. No. 1131).
18	The Clerk is directed to transmit copies of this Order to all counsel.
