Considering the parties have already briefed the issue, see Dkt. ## 21 22 ¹ Under SAR E(4)(f), Plaintiff must demonstrate "a fair or reasonable probability" of success on 23 the underlying claims: (1) breach of contract (cause of action two) and (2) unjust enrichment (cause of action three). See OS Shipping Co. v. Glob. Mar. Tr.(s) Priv. Ltd., 2011 WL 1750449, at *5 (D. Or. May 24 6, 2011) ("[T]he prevailing test appears to be a "probable cause" standard[.]").
