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15 This matter comes before the Court on Defendants' unopposed motion to terminate
16 consent decree and dismiss the case (Dkt. No. 41). Having thoroughly considered the parties'
17 briefing and the relevant record, the Court hereby GRANTS the motion for the reasons explained
18 herein.

19 On January 5, 2017, the Court granted the parties' joint motion to enter a consent decree
20 (Dkt. No. 32.) Under the consent decree, Defendants could move the Court to terminate the
21 decree and dismiss the case if they had signed a notice of final rulemaking on their proposal to
22 approve, disapprove, or conditionally approve, in whole or in part, the Fairbanks 2015 PM2.5
23 Plan pursuant to section 110(k)(2)-(4) of Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7410(k)(2)-(4), no later
24 than August 28, 2017. (Dkt. No. 32 at 3-4.) In addition, the notice of final rulemaking had to be
25 published in the Federal Register, and the issue of costs of litigation, including reasonable
26 attorney fees, had to be resolved. (*Id.*)

1 On August 21, 2017, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”) signed a notice
2 of final rulemaking on its proposal to approve the Fairbanks North Star Borough Moderate Area
3 Attainment Plan for attainment of the 2006 24-hour fine particulate matter National Ambient Air
4 Quality Standards. (Dkt. No. 41 at 1.) EPA published notice of that final rulemaking in the
5 Federal Register on September 8, 2017. (*Id.*) The parties have resolved the issue of costs of
6 litigation. (*Id.* at 2.) Plaintiffs do not oppose this motion. (*Id.*)

7 For the foregoing reasons, Defendants’ motion to terminate the consent decree and
8 dismiss the case (Dkt. No. 41) is GRANTED. The case is DISMISSED with prejudice.
