Christel. Presently before the Court is Defendant's Stipulated 17 Motion for Remand. Dkt. 19. After reviewing Defendant's Stipulated Motion and the relevant 18 record, the Court recommends the following: 19 Defendant's Motion be granted, and the case be reversed and remanded for further 20 administrative proceedings under sentence four of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g). 21 On remand, the Court recommends the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) hold a de novo 22 hearing and issue a new decision. The Court also recommends the ALJ's review include but not 23 be limited to: 24

1	Obtaining vocational expert testimony to determine whether Plaintiff's assessed
2	limitations allow for the performance of other work in the national economy;
3	Recommencing the five-step sequential evaluation if the record is supplemented.
4	The parties agree that on proper motion the Court should consider Plaintiff's application
5	for costs and attorney fees under 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d) and 42 U.S.C. § 406(b).
6	Given the facts and the parties' stipulation, the Court recommends the District Judge
7	immediately approve this Report and Recommendation.
