MINUTE ORDER

16 The following Minute Order is made by direction of the Court, the Honorable John C.
17 Coughenour, United States District Judge:

18 This matter comes before the Court on Plaintiff Kirk Williams's motion for
19 reconsideration (Dkt. No. 35) of the Court's order (Dkt. No. 33) granting Defendants' motion to
20 dismiss (Dkt. No. 5).

21 Motions for reconsideration are generally disfavored. W.D. Wash. Local Civ. R. 7(h)(1).
22 Reconsideration is appropriate only where there is "manifest error in the prior ruling or a
23 showing of new facts or legal authority which could not have been brought to [the Court's]
24 attention earlier with reasonable diligence." *Id.* "Motions for reconsideration are not the place
25 for parties to make new arguments or to ask the Court to rethink what it has already thought."
26 *Richard v. Kelsey*, 2009 WL 3762844 at *1 (W.D. Wash. Nov. 9, 2009).
