- I have a Masters degree in Computer Science (Nov 2008) from University of Alberta, a reputable Canadian university
- In 2009, I moved to the United States because I decided to choose the US to be my
  home in pursuit of more opportunities. I worked for Microsoft as a software engineer
  for 5.5 years to make the world a better place.
- 7. Now at Facebook, everyday I work with my co-workers to try to make the world more open and connected. While I have the world-class technical skill to connect even the farthest people in the world, I'm unable to have my closest family members at my home. How can I call this country home when my old innocent parents are simply deprived of coming to me? As they age, they need more of my company with them and I need to be with them. My parents will not have visas to travel to the United States by October 18, 2017. If the new travel ban is implemented, I'm the only one who could travel to meet them and this will be a significant distraction to my life and success at work. I have only one sibling in Iran who takes care of my parents and it doesn't work out long term without my engagement in this responsibility. That's why I have to travel to Iran frequently if they cannot come to the US.
- 8. I have a brother who works for Microsoft in Canada, another brother in the US who is similarly a software engineer at Microsoft, and a sister in the US who's married to a talented Iranian manager at PepsiCo. While we're all proud of our roles in this country, the newest travel ban prevents us from calling this country home.

9. Last year, I submitted a green card application for my oldest brother, still in Iran, who would have great opportunities in the US. He's got over a decade experience as a chemist in Darugar Co, one of the biggest Iranian manufacturers of soaps and detergents, now an inventory planner at Bahman, a reputable hospital in Tehran. With this travel ban, we cannot bring him in here and it's breaking all the dreams me and my siblings had. He will not have his green card by October 18, 2017. My siblings and I are all hardworking people fueled by our dreams, serving this country, bringing values, not just occupying but also creating jobs, paying same tax as other citizens, but in the end, deprived of a simple right to invite our family to our home by the new travel ban.

10. Although I love the US, if this travel ban is executed, moving to Canada would be a serious consideration for me where all my family members would be free to travel to. I can't tolerate this discrimination and getting treated like a second class citizen in the US. Given my degree from Canada, my outstanding resume at Microsoft and Facebook, and my immigration status in Canada (with a US citizenship), I'll have great work and life opportunities there too which makes me think about migrating to a safer country where I don't need to worry about immigration laws on my birth country.
