ORDER ON REQUEST FOR  
ATTORNEYS' FEES

The Court is in the process of considering a Stipulated Motion to Disburse Interplead Funds. (Dkt. No. 42.) Before that motion can be finally adjudicated, however, the question of the amount of attorney fees and costs due to Plaintiffs' counsel needs to be settled.

Plaintiffs' counsel, via the Declaration of Maren Norton (Dkt. No. 49), submitted a request for attorneys' fees and costs totaling \$35,445.81 (to be paid out of the interplead fund of \$75,000)<sup>1</sup>. That request was opposed by Defendant First Premier Funding (one of the two

1 defendants submitting the disbursal request; *see* Dkt. No. 50); Plaintiffs responded to that  
2 objection with a reply brief. (Dkt. No. 53.)

3 The Court notes from the outset that, for what is a relatively routine interpleader action  
4 with a minimum of activity or complications, Plaintiffs' attorneys' fees request appears  
5 excessive. This assessment is exacerbated by the failure of Plaintiffs' counsel to submit any  
6 billing records to indicate why and how four attorneys (some charging \$400/hour) required a  
7 total of 70 hours to complete their work on this rather straightforward legal proceeding. With  
8 that in mind,

9 IT IS ORDERED that Plaintiffs' attorneys will submit to the Court, by no later than  
10 **February 27, 2018**, the documentation supporting their request for attorneys' fees in this matter;  
11 any accompanying briefing shall not exceed twelve (12) pages in length. Defendant First  
12 Premier will have seven (7) days from the date of that filing to submit any objections, subject to  
13 the same page limit.
