


1 The party asserting jurisdiction has the burden of establishing all jurisdictional facts. See
2 U.S. v. Orr Water Ditch Co., 600 F.3d 1152, 1157 (9th Cir. 2010); Fed R. Civ. P. 12(h)(3) (“If
3 the court determines at any time that it lacks subject-matter jurisdiction, the court must dismiss
4 the action”). Plaintiff has failed to allege, much less establish, the basis of the Court’s
5 jurisdiction. For the foregoing reasons, plaintiff is hereby ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE why
6 the complaint should not be dismissed for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. Plaintiff shall,
7 within thirty (30) days of this order, file an amended complaint which establishes this Court’s
8 jurisdiction. Such a complaint would either (a) allege a cause of action based on a violation of
9 federal law, or (b) show that the parties are diverse (*i.e.*, that all defendants are residents of a
10 state other than Washington) and that plaintiff is entitled to recover at least \$75,000. If an
11 acceptable amended complaint is not filed within the time proscribed, this action will be
12 dismissed without prejudice.
