**STIPULATION AND ORDER RE
AGREED RIDER TO PROTECTIVE
ORDER REGARDING THE USE AND
DISCLOSURE OF DISCOVERY
PRODUCED BY NONPARTY APPLE
INC.**

1 This agreement is entered into between and among nonparty Apple Inc. (“Apple”) and
2 Donna Reed (“Plaintiff), the named plaintiff in *Reed v. Scientific Games Corp.* No. 18-cv-565-
3 RSL (the “Action”). Plaintiff and Apple anticipate that Apple will produce documents in this action
4 that contain sensitive consumer information. This agreement is intended to supplement the
5 protective order entered by the Court on March 8, 2019 (ECF No. 43) (“Protective Order”).

6 Pursuant to Rule 26(c) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Court finds good
7 cause for the following Agreed Rider To Protective Order Regarding The Use And Disclosure
8 Of Discovery Produced By Nonparty Apple Inc. (“Rider”).

9 **PURPOSES AND LIMITATIONS**

10 Apple Protected Material designated under the terms of this Rider shall be used by the
11 Parties solely for the purpose of providing notice to and verifying and paying the recovery amount
12 owed to each member of the Settlement Class. Apple Protected Material shall not be used directly
13 or indirectly for any other purpose whatsoever.

14 No Apple Protected Material provided by Apple to the Class Action Administrator under
15 the terms of this Rider may be shared with any of the Parties, unless specifically authorized by this
16 Rider.

17 It is the intention of Apple and the Parties that this Rider will protect all materials produced
18 by Apple in the Actions unless otherwise specified.

19 **DEFINITIONS**

20 “Class Action Administrator” means JND Legal Administration, acting as class action
21 administrator to effect the Class Action Settlement Agreement entered.

22 “Class Action Settlement Agreement” means the document filed at ECF No. 164-1 in the
23 Action.

24 “Outside Counsel” means (i) outside counsel who appear on the pleadings as counsel for a
25 Party and (ii) partners, associates, and staff of such counsel to whom it is reasonably necessary to
26 disclose the information for this litigation.

1 “Apple Protected Material” means any discovery produced by Apple in the Actions.

2 “Settlement Class” has the meaning provided in the Class Action Settlement Agreement.

3 **COMPUTATION OF TIME**

4 The computation of any period of time prescribed or allowed by this Order shall be
5 governed by the provisions for computing time set forth in Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 6.

6 **SCOPE**

7 The protections conferred by this Rider cover not only the Apple Protected Material
8 governed by this Rider as addressed herein, but also any information copied or extracted therefrom,
9 as well as all copies, excerpts, summaries, or compilations thereof, plus testimony, conversations,
10 or presentations by Parties or their counsel in court or in other settings that might reveal Apple
11 Protected Material.

12 Nothing in this Rider shall prevent or restrict Apple’s own disclosure or use of its own
13 Apple Protected Material for any purpose, and nothing in this Rider shall preclude Apple from
14 showing its Apple Protected Material to an individual who prepared the Apple Protected Material.

15 **DURATION**

16 Even after the termination of this case, the confidentiality obligations imposed by this
17 Order shall remain in effect until a Producing Party agrees otherwise in writing or a court order
18 otherwise directs, subject to the Final Disposition clause herein.

19 **ACCESS TO APPLE PROTECTED MATERIAL**

20 Basic Principles. All Apple Protected Material shall be used solely for the purpose of
21 providing notice to and verifying and paying the recovery amount owed to members of the
22 Settlement Class, and not for any other purpose whatsoever, including without limitation any other
23 litigation, patent prosecution or acquisition, patent reexamination or reissue proceedings, or any
24 business or competitive purpose or function. Apple Protected Material shall not be provided,
25 distributed, disclosed, or made available to anyone except as expressly provided in this Rider.

1 Secure Storage, No Export. Apple Protected Material must be stored and maintained by a
2 Receiving Party at a location in the United States and in a secure manner that ensures that access
3 is limited to the persons authorized under this Rider. To ensure compliance with applicable United
4 States Export Administration Regulations, Apple Protected Material may not be exported outside
5 the United States or released to any foreign national (even if within the United States).

6 Legal Advice Based on Apple Protected Material. Nothing in this Rider shall be construed
7 to prevent counsel from advising their clients with respect to this case based in whole or in part
8 upon Apple Protected Materials, provided counsel does not disclose the Apple Protected Material
9 itself except as provided in this Rider.

10 Limitations. Nothing in this Rider shall restrict in any way Apple’s use or disclosure of its
11 own Apple Protected Material.

12 Designation. For the avoidance of doubt, in all circumstances not specifically addressed
13 by this Rider, all Apple Protected Material shall be treated as if designated “CONFIDENTIAL”
14 under the Protective Order regardless of whether the Apple Protected Material has been
15 stamped or marked in accordance with that Order.

16 **USE OF PROTECTED MATERIAL**

17 It is Apple’s and the Parties’ intention that Apple will produce Apple Protected Materials
18 directly to the Class Action Administrator, with no production to any of the Parties.

19 Unless otherwise ordered by the Court or authorized through the prior written consent of
20 Apple, the Class Action Administrator may disclose Apple Protected Materials only to those
21 members of the Class Action Administrator’s staff, or to any copying, clerical or other support
22 services working at the direction of the Class Action Administrator, to whom disclosure is
23 reasonably necessary in order to provide notice to and/or to verify and pay the recovery amount
24 owed to members of the Settlement Class, provided that each such person to whom disclosure is
25 made must first agree to be bound by the provisions of this Rider by signing a copy of Exhibit A.

1 Nothing in the foregoing paragraph is intended to restrict the Class Action Administrator
2 from disclosing to a member of the Settlement Class any Apple Protected Material that specifically
3 relates to that individual.

4 Certain Members of the Settlement Class: Thirty days prior to the claims deadline, and
5 subject to Apple's prior written consent (such consent not to be unreasonably withheld), the Class
6 Action Administrator shall furnish to Counsel for Plaintiff the contact information for and Lifetime
7 Spending Amount associated with each Settlement Class Member who (1) has a Lifetime Spending
8 Amount of greater than or equal to \$25,000, and (2) has not yet filed a claim. Plaintiff and Apple
9 further agree that Plaintiff may request Apple's written consent that the aforementioned Lifetime
10 Spending Amount threshold (i.e., \$25,000) be lowered, and Apple agrees to consider any such
11 request in good faith.

12 For the avoidance of doubt, no Settlement Class Member contact information or Lifetime
13 Spending Amounts shall be provided to Counsel for Plaintiff unless Counsel for Plaintiff have
14 been appointed by the Court as Class Counsel.

15 Any contact information disclosed to counsel for Plaintiff pursuant to this section shall be
16 used solely for the purpose of providing notice of the Class Action Settlement Agreement to
17 members of the Settlement Class, and counsel for Plaintiff shall disclose Contact Information only
18 to counsel's staff, or to any copying, clerical or other support services working at the direction of
19 counsel for Plaintiff, to whom disclosure is reasonably necessary to provide notice to the member.
20 All Contact Information relating to a member of the Settlement Class shall be destroyed by counsel
21 for Plaintiff upon confirmation that the member has received actual notice of the Class Action
22 Settlement.

23 **CHALLENGING DESIGNATIONS OF PROTECTED MATERIAL**

24 This Rider is intended to provide no mechanism to the Parties through which they can
25 challenge the designation or protected status of Apple Protected Materials.

1 **SUBPOENAS OR COURT ORDERS**

2 If at any time Apple Protected Material is subpoenaed by any court, arbitral, administrative,
3 or legislative body, the Party to whom the subpoena or other request is directed shall immediately
4 give prompt written notice thereof to Apple and to its counsel and shall provide Apple with an
5 opportunity to move for a protective order regarding the production of Apple Protected Materials
6 implicated by the subpoena.

7 **FILING PROTECTED MATERIAL**

8 Absent written permission from Apple or a court Order secured after appropriate notice to
9 all interested persons, the Parties may not file or disclose in the public record any Apple Protected
10 Material.

11 **INADVERTENT DISCLOSURE NOT AUTHORIZED BY ORDER**

12 In the event of a disclosure of any Apple Protected Material pursuant to this Rider to any
13 person or persons not authorized to receive such disclosure under this Rider, the Party responsible
14 for having made such disclosure, and each Party with knowledge thereof, shall immediately notify
15 counsel for Apple and provide to such counsel all known relevant information concerning the
16 nature and circumstances of the disclosure. The responsible disclosing Party shall also promptly
17 take all reasonable measures to retrieve the improperly disclosed Apple Protected Material and to
18 ensure that no further or greater unauthorized disclosure and/or use thereof is made

19 Unauthorized or inadvertent disclosure does not change the status of Apple Protected
20 Material or waive the right to hold the disclosed document or information as Protected.

21 **FINAL DISPOSITION**

22 Not later than ninety (90) days after closure of the Final Disposition of this case, each Party
23 and the Class Action Administrator shall return all Discovery Material of a Producing Party to the
24 respective outside counsel of the Producing Party or destroy such Material, at the option of Apple.
25 For purposes of this Order, “Final Disposition” occurs after an order, mandate, or dismissal finally
26 terminating the above-captioned action with prejudice, including all appeals.
27

1 All Parties that have received any such Discovery Material, as well as the Class Action
2 Administrator, shall certify in writing that all such materials have been returned to counsel for
3 Apple or destroyed.

4 **MISCELLANEOUS**

5 **Termination of Matter and Retention of Jurisdiction.** The Parties and Apple agree that the
6 terms of this Rider shall survive and remain in effect after the Final Determination of the Actions.
7 The Court shall retain jurisdiction after Final Determination of the matter to hear and resolve any
8 disputes arising out of this Rider.

9 **Successors.** This Rider shall be binding upon Apple and the Parties hereto, their attorneys,
10 and their successors, executors, personal representatives, administrators, heirs, legal
11 representatives, assigns, subsidiaries, divisions, employees, agents, retained consultants and
12 experts, and any persons or organizations over which they have direct control.

13 **Modification by Court.** This Order is subject to further court order based upon public policy
14 or other considerations, and the Court may modify this Order *sua sponte* in the interests of justice.
15 The United States District Court for the Western District of Washington is responsible for the
16 interpretation and enforcement of this Order. All disputes concerning Apple Protected Material,
17 however designated, produced under the protection of this Order shall be resolved by the United
18 States District Court for the Western District Washington.

19 **Discovery Rules Remain Unchanged.** Nothing herein shall alter or change in any way the
20 discovery provisions of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Local Rules for the United States
21 District Court for the Western District of Washington, or the Court's own orders. Identification
22 of any individual pursuant to this Protective Order does not make that individual available for
23 deposition or any other form of discovery outside of the restrictions and procedures of the Federal
24 Rules of Civil Procedure, the Local Rules for the United States District Court for Western District
25 of Washington, or the Court's own orders.
