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review and resolve any petition for attorneys' fees and costs that Plaintiffs Sound Action, et al., may file under the Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA), 28 U.S.C. § 2412. The Corps reserves the right to oppose any such petition for fees and costs on any grounds.

To afford the Parties an opportunity to pursue a settlement of such a fee petition, they propose the following proceedings: Plaintiffs file a motion for fees and costs within 30 days of the date of an order of dismissal and a concurrent motion to stay all briefing (including Plaintiffs' opening memorandum) on the motion for fees and costs for 90 days in order to facilitate settlement discussions. Plaintiffs' motion for fees and costs shall identify the full amount Plaintiffs seek and shall include a breakdown of the attorney hours Plaintiffs used to develop such amount. Provided this motion for fees and costs is filed within this 30-day period, the Corps stipulates that it will not contest the timeliness or completeness of Plaintiffs' motion for fees and costs, for purposes of satisfying the 30-day filing period in EAJA.

Plaintiffs stipulate to this motion and proposed order.

STIPULATED MOTION AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

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ORDER DISMISSING CASE

Based on this stipulated motion, and for good cause shown, it is hereby ORDERED on this <u>17th</u> day of <u>April</u>, 2020, that this case is DISMISSED with prejudice. The Court will retain jurisdiction only to review and resolve any motion for attorneys' fees and costs that Plaintiffs Sound Action, et al., may file under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412. The Corps reserves the right to oppose any such petition for fees and costs on any grounds.

Plaintiffs shall file a motion for fees and costs within 30 days of the date of this order of dismissal and a concurrent motion to stay all briefing (including Plaintiffs' opening memorandum) on the motion for fees and costs for 90 days in order to facilitate settlement discussions between the Parties.
