11 The following Minute Order is made by direction of the Court, the Honorable
12 Thomas S. Zilly, United States District Judge:

13 (1) Plaintiff's Stipulated Motion, docket no. 54, is GRANTED. The Court
issues the following amended schedule:

14 **JURY TRIAL** set for **9:00 AM on January 24, 2022**

15 Motions due by August 26, 2021

16 Discovery completed by October 4, 2021

17 Dispositive Motions due by November 4, 2021
and noted on the motions calendar no later
18 than the fourth Friday thereafter (see LCR 7(d))

19 Motions related to expert witnesses
(e.g., Daubert motion) due by November 18, 2021
20 and noted on the motions calendar no later
than the third Friday thereafter (see LCR 7(d))

9 Notwithstanding Local Civil Rule 16.1, the exhibit list shall be prepared in table
10 format with the following columns: "Exhibit Number," "Description," "Admissibility
11 Stipulated," "Authenticity Stipulated/Admissibility Disputed," "Authenticity Disputed,"
12 and "Admitted." The latter column is for the Clerk's convenience and shall remain
13 blank, but the parties shall indicate the status of an exhibit's authenticity and
14 admissibility by placing an "X" in the appropriate column. Duplicate documents shall
15 not be listed twice: once a party has identified an exhibit in the pretrial order, any party
16 may use it.

17 The original and one copy of the trial exhibits are to be delivered to the courtroom
18 at a time coordinated with Gail Glass, who can be reached at 206-370-8522, no later than
19 the Friday before trial. Each set of exhibits shall be submitted in a three-ring binder with
20 appropriately numbered tabs. Each exhibit shall be clearly marked. Plaintiff's exhibits
21 shall be numbered consecutively beginning with 1; defendant's exhibits shall be
22 numbered consecutively beginning with the next multiple of 100 after plaintiff's last
23 exhibit; any other party's exhibits shall be numbered consecutively beginning with the
next multiple of 100 after defendant's last exhibit. For example, if plaintiff's last exhibit
is numbered 159, then defendant's exhibits shall begin with the number 200; if
defendant's last exhibit number is 321, then any other party's exhibits shall begin with
the number 400.
